Corey Robin is a Professor of Political Science at the Graduate Center, CUNY. His research interests span a wide range of modern political theorists – Hobbes, Montesquieu, Tocqueville, Schmitt, Arendt and Hayek – and topics: the workplace as a regime of governmentality, the idea of national security, liberalism and libertarianism, and the politics of despotism and practice of free speech. His major publications include *Fear: The History of a Political Idea* (Oxford, 2004) and *The Reactionary Mind: Conservatism from Edmund Burke to Sarah Palin* (Oxford, 2011). He is currently writing a book on the political theory of capitalism, a counter-history of the free market that looks at, among other figures, Burke and Smith, slaveholders in the Old South, theorists of fascism, and contemporary exponents of neoliberalism.
