'Auctoritas'

The Greek-speaking Roman senator Dio Cassius mentions that the Latin term '*auctoritas*' has no exact equivalent in Greek. The paper discusses some questions about the translatability of ethical and political terms, and some approaches to understanding '*auctoritas*' and modern concepts of authority. The underlying thesis is that we would be better off without a strong unitary concept of 'authority'.
