Eric Nelson is Robert M. Beren Professor of Government at Harvard University. His research interests include the history of republican political theory, secularization, theories of property, and the intersection between the history of political thought and the history of scholarship. He is the author of several books, including *The Greek Tradition in Republican Thought* (Cambridge, 2004), *The Hebrew Republic: Jewish Sources and the Transformation of European Political Thought* (Harvard, 2010) and, most recently, *The Royalist Revolution: Monarchy and the American Founding* (Harvard, 2014). Professor Nelson holds degrees from Harvard and Cambridge, and he has been a fellow in the Harvard Society of Fellows and at Trinity College, Cambridge. His current book project explores the theological origins of arguments in contemporary liberal and egalitarian political philosophy.
