Richard Tuck is Frank G. Thomson Professor of Government at Harvard University. Professor Tuck was previously University Lecturer in the History Faculty at Cambridge, and he remains an Honorary Fellow of Jesus College. His works include *Natural Rights Theories* (1979), *Hobbes* (1989), *Philosophy and Government, 1572-1651* (1993), *The Rights of War and Peace: Political Thought and the International Order from Grotius to Kant* (1999) and *Free Riding* (2008). Most recently, his Seeley Lectures delivered to the University of Cambridge in May 2012, have been converted into a book, *The Sleeping Sovereign: The Invention of Modern Democracy* (2016). He has also produced editions of Hobbes's *Leviathan* (1991), Hobbes's *The Citizen* (1998) and Hugo Grotius's *The Rights of War and Peace* (2005). Professor Tuck is a Fellow of the British Academy and a Foreign Honorary Member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.
