Karma Nabulsi is an Associate Professor in the Department of Politics and International Relations at the University of Oxford and Library Fellow of St Edmund Hall. She is editor of the register of civic needs for Palestinian refugees and exiles, and was director of the national civic voter registration drive from 2011–14. Dr Nabulsi has led a number of major research projects. Most recently, she directed a British Academy sponsored project, "Teaching Contemporary Palestinian Political History", for which she won the Guardian Higher Education Network's 'Inspiring Leader' Award in 2017. Dr Nabulsi's new book, *The Invisible History: Prevent and the Persistence of Empire*, will be published later this year with Verso Books.
